The teams in this athletics event consist of 5 girls and 5 boys. Each child does a 75m sprint, a longer 600m run, a vortex throw and a standing long jump.

Each Individuals time or measurement is converted into points and added together with the others to make a team score.

Gold – Raglan 1551 points

Silver – Grange Park 1525 points

Bronze – St James 1467
