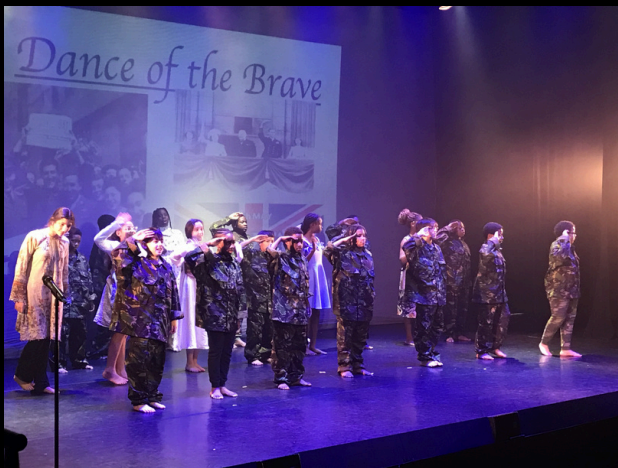


# Dance Festival 2026
